Speakers

PROF. JULIEN CHAISSE

Prof. Julien Chaisse is Professor of Law at City University of Hong Kong. Prof. Chaisse specialises in international Law, with a special focus on globalization and on Asian economies.

DR. PRABHASH RANJAN

Dr. Ranjan is an Assistant Professor of law at the South Asian University, New Delhi, India. He teaches and publishes in the area of international investment law and world trade law. He has been a Visiting Fellow at the Lauterpacht Centre for International Law, Cambridge University, Visiting scholar at Brookings India amongst other reputed institutions.

DR. KABIR DUGGAL

Dr. Duggal is a Senior International Arbitration Advisor at Arnold & Porter, New York, as well as a Lecturer in Law at Columbia Law School. He has a focus on investment arbitration, international commercial arbitration and public international law. He has had extensive experience in this field as both counsel, and arbitrator. He has participated in numerous investment arbitration disputes.

MR. THOMAS SEBASTIAN

Mr. Sebastian is a Barrister at Monckton Chambers, London. He has significant experience in disputes arising from public international law, commercial dispute resolution, competition law, EU law etc. He has also represented investors in billion-dollar arbitrations. He has appeared before a variety of fora, including investment arbitration tribunals. Mr. Sebastian is a Rhodes Scholar and completed his BCL and MPhil from Oxford University.

MR. A.K SARAN

Mr. Saran is a Director at the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India. Before joining the Ministry of Home Affairs, he served as the Director in the Ministry of Shipping and was part of India's representatives in the investment dispute with Louis Dreyfus Armateurs SAS.

He is also an adjunct professor at Georgetown University, and teaches investor-state arbitration. He is also a co-director of the ILI International Investment Law Centre. He has represented various countries in investment arbitrations under BITs, and has also advised various countries on aspects of BITs and commercial arbitrations.
